Title of the practice:

"Girish Karnad Film Club"

1. The Context:

The dynamic and interdisciplinary approach is the need of the hour, in the higher education. Now a day the electronic media and audio-visuals play a vital role in shaping the personality of the young generation. Unfortunately, the commercial movies adversely influence the likes and dislikes of the students. The parallel classical cinema in India and abroad, we thought, could give dynamic quality insight to the students of our college on various aspects of human life:

As an art, the cinema is a fine contribution of technology, literature, photography, cinematography, music etc. and opens a wide range for career opportunities. The documentaries, biographical sketches, movies on social, technological aspects can enrich the students in many aspects. It is a practice, which goes beyond the walls of the classroom but serves the same academic purpose more effectively.

2. Objectives -

- To introduce the students to Indian and international cinema.
- ii. Acquainting the students with the qualitative aspects of visual art.
- iii. Help them to improve their extra-curricular activities like acting, music, dance etc. This will help ultimately to enable them to participate & perform in the University Competition.
- To deeper their insight and broader views and enrich the knowledge through the visual art.
- v. Qualitative and representative movies on various aspects of human life.

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3. The practice -

- Forming of a Film club named 'Girish Karnad film club'. It is named after one of the stalwarts of the Indian cinema, theater and literature.
- ii) After every fifteen days, mostly on the 2nd Saturday the film club students use to watch a classic movie of internationally reputed directors like Akiro kurosova, Satyajit ray, De Sica, Rossellini etc.
- iii) A discussion before the movie show and after the show is conducted and students share their views and opinions about the movie, documentary etc.
- iv) Students also do suggest some names of the movies and if it is up to the standard according to the director of a film club, shown to the students.
- Books on the movies, visuals arts, music etc. have been purchased in the library to support this activity and some students eagerly read these books.
- vi) Students can approach for the copies of the film shown and if available copies are given to the students without any charge.
- vii) Lectures on 'film appreciation' are arranged for the students.
- viii) This 'film club' is a joint activity with the film society of India, leaded by Kiran Shantaram, a noted director and producer.

4. Obstacles faced -

- i) Generally, the students are not habitual with the parallel classical cinema. They feel a huge difference between the commercial and parallel, classical cinema.
- The entertainment value of these classical movies for students is less than commercial movies. Students sometimes feel boring
- iii) Some movies though outstanding are in foreign languages and students are ignorant about it. They don't understand the story and the content of it.
- iv) The reference of the some movies is according to the time and place. If the observer is ignorant about the background he loses interest immediately and gets bored.
- v) Some movies are beyond the intellectual capacity of the students.

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5. Strategy to overcome -The content, framework, story, special attention points are briefed to the students, before the show. II) About the director, actors, and other relevant information is given to the III) The time and reference frame of the movies is described to increase their understanding. Sometimes during the show and after the show discussions are held and students are motivated to opine and express. 6. Impact i) We have observed that students are increasingly becoming aware of these kinds of parallel, classical movies. ii) They have been able to develop their liking and do understand the aesthetic values of visual art. iii) They compare the different commercial movies with classical movies and discuss about it.
